Opportunities for the children...

World Book Day Selfies - thank you for the photos that have been emailed through - it was lovely to see the funny places the children were reading their favourite stories! All children involved will receive a prize and certificate before we break up for Easter. We also loved the 'snow day' photos that you shared with us on our Facebook page... they cheered us up no end!

Woodhouse Close library has invited us for Storytime on Monday 19th March from 11am - 11.30am and 2.30pm - 3pm. The children can dress up in their World Book Day outfits if they have one and can walk in it. Please pick up your child from there.

'Each Peach, Pear, Plum' workshop – some of our older children will be taking part in an Each Peach, Pear, Plum (lovely rhyming storybook full of Nursery Rhyme characters) workshop at Wharton Park, Durham. We will look forward to hearing about their adventure.

Spanish lessons with Lingotots - We are in the final stages of securing some funding, via Councillor Tanya Tucker, for the children to have Spanish lessons at Nursery. Ready, Sett, Read project - During the Autumn Term, our Nursery was involved in an early reading project designed to raise the profile of reading for pleasure and language and communication development, through the repeated reading of a selection of picture books. The local library was also involved with the project, and members of their team visited the Nursery each week, to share a story with the children. The children thoroughly enjoyed the stories shared and the activities provided. It was also lovely to see the children retelling the stories to their friends and parents, and to hear that many of them are now accessing the local library. We loved your emails and photos too!

We have given our feedback to the project leaders - we suggested that the book given to parents and carers was tricky for you to write on; that some of the books were out of print and therefore tricky for us to buy and also that one of the books was very long for young children.

The children were observed and anonymous data from 10 children was used to write up the case study. All of these children made at least expected progress.
